Motion nr. 32500-V, 110 [Parliament of the Netherlands]

The Parliament,

after hearing the deliberations,

putting on record that the EU is negotiating with India about a free trade treaty and has the intention to include a sustainability chapter in which sustainable development and fundamental labour rights are central issues;

putting on record that India has indicated not to want such a chapter and that the negotiations on this issue have therefore not progressed very much;

considering that the absence of such a paragraph threatens to increase the large social inequality and environmental problems in India;

of the opinion that the absence of such a chapter would be undesirable as it would undermine the sustainability chapters in other EU trade agreements;

considering that the 250 million so-called Dalits are still discriminated and exploited massively and that India has the largest number of working children in the world;

requests the government to exert its efforts in the European context for a robust sustainability chapter, in which among other things is being aimed at: the reduction of child labour, the improvement of the position of Dalits, the availability of medicines for HIV/AIDS and a dispute settlement mechanism; and not to be agree with strongly weakened compromise,

and returns to the order of the day.
